**Undergraduate Nursing Update**

First semester junior nursing students enrolled in NURS 301: Health Assessment have been busy this semester providing health screenings at several community sites. The health screenings allowed the students to practice taking blood pressures and gave them an opportunity to interact with a variety of people in the community. On September 10 and 17, 2014, they went to Johnson Controls and to the Leatherman Senior Center to do blood pressures, finger stick glucose and cholesterol tests, and weights. On October 15, 2014, the students went to Worthington Industries to provide flu shots and blood pressure screenings. The first semester juniors also participated in a campus-wide flu shot clinic at the Lee Nursing Building Lobby on October 15, 2014. On November 1, 2014, the students did foot screenings, finger stick glucose tests, and blood pressures at the McLeod Diabetes Fair. Each group of students created a poster on a health-related topic that was displayed during the screening. Educational materials on hypertension, exercise, and weight loss were available for the participants at the screenings. The nursing students reviewed the pamphlets and answered questions from the patients at the screenings. The health screenings have been made possible through a Project REAL grant through FMU!

**MSN/Nurse Educator  
Program Options**

In December, four students graduated from the MSN Nurse Educator track, and two FNP students earned a Certificate in Nursing Education. The MSN Nurse Educator track is a 36 credit, fully online program that prepares the graduate to serve as a nurse educator in the academic as well as clinical practice area. Three of the courses are offered as a collaborative effort with the Graduate School of Education. In addition to online coursework, learners complete 270 total practicum hours in the academic and clinical nurse educator role. The Certificate in Nursing Education is designed for the FNP who is interested in teaching and can be earned with the completion of three designated nursing education courses.
